#### FINDING PEACE THROUGH PRAYER

(How to Pray | ComeUntoChrist

**HOW TO PRAY** - God is your loving Father in Heaven, and He wants to hear from you. You can reach out to Him by praying to Him. As His child, you can ask your Heavenly Father for help and guidance in your life.

Four steps to prayer - Praying can be done aloud or in your mind. You can speak to God like you would any other person. Your words do not have to be eloquent or memorized. It is more important to open your heart. Believe He is there and listening because He is. Believe He will help you because He will. Prayer is one the most valuable gifts you have received from your loving Heavenly Father.

- **1 Begin your prayer** , find a quiet place where you feel comfortable. A good way to start is to address God by name. You could try "Dear God," "Heavenly Father," or simply "God."
- 2 Have a conversation with God Speak from your heart and share your hopes and desires as well as your worries and problems. You can ask God for help, direction, forgiveness, or healing. Whatever is on your mind, bring it to Him, admitting that His wisdom and timing is greater than yours. Share your feeling with God about others. You can pray for their needs or ask for ways you can love and help them. Express appreciation for all the blessings in your life. Even challenges can be a blessing. Gratitude helps us feel humble, keeping our hearts and minds more open to God's answers.
- **3 End your prayer** Once you've said all that you wanted to say, you can end your prayer by saying, "In the name of Jesus Christ, amen." We do this because Jesus commanded us to pray in His name.
- **4 Act on your righteous desires** "Pray as if everything depends on the Lord, then work as if everything depends on you." It is in the process of doing that we often get guidance and help from God.

WHEN TO PRAY - There is no such thing as praying too much. God wants to hear from you when you're happy, or sad, or if you just need someone to talk to.

You can pray whenever you feel like it or need it. In fact, if you don't feel like praying, or feel like God doesn't want to hear from you, that might be one of the best times to pray.

Pray throughout the day - Typical times for personal prayer are as you start your day in the morning, before each meal, and before you go to bed at night. But there is never a wrong time to pray. God is always listening, so we can "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

**Pray for special circumstances** - There are times that call for extra prayer: like a prayer for healing, for protection, or for urgent needs. Getting answers to our prayers - God promises that when we turn to Him in prayer, He will give us answers and guidance. "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you." Matthew 7:7 God communicates with us through the Holy Spirit in the form of good thoughts and ideas or peaceful, comforting feelings. When we feel those things, it means God is encouraging us, and giving us direction. Everyone will feel the Holy Spirit in their own way. Often, God answers our prayers through others. God can put people into our lives at the right time who can give or be the answer we have been looking for. We can also get answers to prayers by reading the Bible. When we pray and read, the Holy Spirit can give us personalized ideas and direction. Taking time to study His word is also a way we can show God that we truly desire an answer from Him.



## Casual Walk-Through Matthew's Gospel

This month looks at Matthew 3:1-3. We might say that John the Baptist came "to wake people up." He quickly became a well-known preacher, calling people to, "Repent for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near." The word "repent" has a lot more to it than we generally think of today.

John's word "repent" could very well be said to mean "turn around." It is a word calling upon people to change their HEART and MIND about what was important in their lives....AND THEN TO CHANGE THEIR LIVES ACCORDINGLY. To repent as John the Baptist used the word did not simply mean, "Oops, I made a mistake, sorry about that." No, to repent is not simply to say the words. It is to make an internal change in your life. Actually, it means to make an inward change of the heart and mind. True repentance becomes real as one's life displays the "turn around." That is why the Phillips Modern English Bible says it this way: "You must change your hearts and minds— for the Kingdom of Heaven has arrived."

The people listening to John the Baptist, generally had a very clear understanding of what he meant by the words he used. In juxtaposition, I suspect we think of repentance as an inward act of the heart. But are we not much more apt to sidestep the importance of our actions? You see, to really repent means to not only express a plea for forgiveness, but

also to BE DETERMINED NOT TO DO IT AGAIN! John the Baptist quoted the prophet Isaiah to give credibility to his ministry.

Today we may do the same kind of thing. We quote from the scriptures, we quote early Christian disciples, we refer to the words written by past and present professors who are teachers of the faith. That is what John the Baptist was doing (in our reading for this discussion), and it was a great quote for his followers. "This is the one of whom the prophet spoke."

Before we leave this bit of scripture, I want to say that in all that has been said above, we should seriously see why we need to educate our children in the faith. We need to give them some degree of knowledge so that when they are on their own, they will have a base of understanding of the Christian faith. We all need to have something to compare, or to weigh the value of, the way word thoughts paint a false picture to get us to accept falsehoods. IGNORANCE OF THE GOSPEL CAN CAUSE FEAR in the minds OF ALMOST ANYONE. FEAR CAN EASILY BE A MOTIVE FOR JOINING ANYTHING THOUGHT TO HAVE A VALID POSITIVE AVENUE FOR THEIR LIFE'S JOURNEY.

Don't let your children or grandchildren or others succumb to SOME DISASTROUS HOAX. In doing so, many have been forced to give up their families, many have had to give up their identity, and many have been sexually abused by the SO-CALLED SUPREME CHIEF OF THE CULT.

Anything less than the beautiful Gospel of Love given to us by God's Son, Jesus the Christ, is not good enough. Any cause for one to be taken in by a cult can usually be traced to the lack of parental training.

YES, John the Baptist called people to "turn around," to understand that "the kingdom of heaven has come near."

He would say the same words today to you, and to me. Every generation needs to grasp this message. We need to share the importance of it with all people, lest the message of the Gospel become tainted by the lack of this truth. Repent. Put your focus on Jesus, the one God sent to us that we might live in peace, joy and a love that has no point of termination in life nor in what we call death.....think about it.
